- We are working on the revitalization of the association, which has waned in power and membership as of late
- o Post Office Box is currently only paid for until May
  - upkeep for this is \$182/yr and it is required for our continued existence

#### 3) Elections

- There are a minimum of 4 roles we need to fill before conducting any business with the City of Tucson; other positions/committees may be filled later
  - **President** chairs meetings, sets agenda
  - Vice President fills in for president when needed
  - Secretary takes minutes during these meetings
  - **Treasurer** manages association money, makes monthly reports
- All 4 of these people need to be present in order to open a bank account for the association (though not necessarily at the same time); they will need a photo ID that matches their current address. We are currently looking to open an account at Tucson Old Pueblo Credit Union.

#### 4) Define our Identity

- o A new name
  - Should we change our name from NUNA to something else? This could distance ourselves from the University of Arizona and indicate we are separate entities.
- Why do we want to exist in the first place?
  - What do we want out of the neighborhood? What amenities are we lacking?
  - More than just a place to live, a neighborhood is an expression of our shared identity. What is it that makes us a neighborhood and not just a collection of residences?
  - What do we want the neighborhood to look like in the future? Having clearly defined goals helps prioritize what to work on and guides our interactions with the city
  - What are our core values? Walkability, pedestrian dignity, access to green space, better transportation, and safety are a few of the many examples.
- The answer to these questions will likely take shape over many future meetings; for now they are presented and recorded here merely for your own reflection.
- o Update bylaws
  - The bylaws we have registered with the city are outdated. New ones will need to be drafted and approved by the city. This is another long term goal

### 5) Allocation of Neighborhood Parking Funds

- o Funds are available for neighborhood improvements.
  - Park Tucson has money set aside for us which they have collected from selling people parking permits to park in our neighborhood. A lot has accumulated over the years that can be put to good use
  - The money is not directly controlled by the association, but we may direct its use
  - Any use of the money must be done on land owned by the city (streets, easements, etc.)
